As we approach the end of my first full year as President of AmCham Serbia, I wanted to use this opportunity to thank you all for participating in the joint efforts we have made in 2014 to make Serbia a better place to do business.

In addition to developing young managers through our AmChamps program, and recognizing exceptional businesses and individuals with our Leader in Change Awards, we have also shown as a group that we can be counted on to stand up and lead when the times were tough - with more than EUR 7 million donated amongst us when catastrophic flooding hit in May 2014. AmCham member companies were leaders in solidarity, relief and rebuilding.

I personally thank you for your active participation and would like to ask you to remain as determined and committed to our AmCham community as we have been so far. Let us remain the leaders in change in 2015!

IMPROVING BUSINESS ENVIRONMENT

STRONG PERFORMANCE ON TOP PRIORITIES IN 2014

As a result of the AmCham improving business environment survey conducted at the end of 2013, five overall policy battlefields were chosen by the members as priorities for AmCham in 2014. Out of these five top priorities, significant results have been achieved in the four areas, namely:

Labour law changes, in line with AmCham suggestions, managed to increase flexibility and decrease the administrative burden for employers

Amendments to the **Insolvency law**, achieved improved **protection of creditors** in insolvency proceedings

Reducing administration in construction permit procedures as well as a decrease in local fees related to construction have been achieved through Amendments to the Law on Planning and Construction

The Government has taken notable ad-hoc steps in reduction of the grey economy, while the Draft systemic roof Law on Inspections Supervision is in the final stages of adoption.

The only area with no significant progress was fiscal and parafiscal predictability.



























CORPORATE AND BUSINESS LAW COMMITTEE

Fine tuning of regulations:

The Law on Insolvency was successfully amended in July, incorporating the bulk of the joint suggestions of the Corporate Law and Finance and Tax Committee, aimed at expediting the insolvency procedure, protecting creditors and removing obstacles present in implementation.

The Law on Data Protection

- advocacy for amending the current law, which poses significant difficulties in terms of red tape for everyday functioning, has been initiated Facilitating enforcement of corporate law regulations and easing compliance – implementation of the Company Law by the Business Registry, as well as compliance with the newly amended Insolvency Law, was discussed at separate workshops with law drafters, relevant implementing authorities and judiciary representatives.

FINANCE AND TAX COMMITTEE

The Finance and Tax Committee advocated for amending the relevant regulations for easier collection of receivables and a stronger position of creditors. Concrete suggestions were provided to the authorities focusing on the effects of the application of the Law on Payment Deadlines and improving Law on Factoring and the Law on Protection of Users of Financial Services

Regulatory finalization of the parafiscal reform has been stalled since midsummer, as work on the Law on Compensations for the Use of Public Goods and the Law on Financing Local Administration has been discontinued. The Finance and

Tax Committee was advocating for making an exhaustive inventory of compensations for the use of public goods, their levels and alteration mechanism in the new law, as well as effectively decreasing peaks and arbitrariness in charging local levies and charges.

The Finance and Tax Committee initiated coordination with the new leadership of the Tax Administration, pointing to inconsistencies in law implementation and asking for uniform and transparent interpretation of the tax regulations (providing internal guidance for interpretation and transparency for the taxpayers).

HEALTH CARE COMMITTEE

The Ministry of Health accepted collaboration and patronage of a joint Ministry – AmCham Health Care Committee study aiming at sustainability of health care financing, improving efficiencies and synergies between private and public health sectors in Serbia.

Ernst & Young has been selected as the implementing consultancy for a 6-month study that will provide policy recommendations for sustainable health care financing, better financial management of public hospitals, synergies between private and public health service providers as well as other forms of public-private partnerships for the benefit of insured persons.

Advocating for open and transparent public discussion on changing the method of calculating administratively set prices of medicines. Upon the announcement of amending by-laws governing setting the maximum prices of medicines, the Health Care Committee reacted by asking for broader public consultation and providing concrete suggestions. The announced amendments were subsequently withdrawn.

ICT COMMITTEE

The newly established ICT
Committee focused its efforts in
2014 in establishing partnership
with the Government through
meetings with high officials from
the Directorate for eGovernment,
Ministry of Trade, Tourism and
Telecommunications, Ministry of
Interior, Ministry of Education,
Science and Technological
Development and Ministry of Justice.

The Committee analyzed the **Draft Strategy for the Development of eGovernment** and sent
recommendations aimed at
improving the proposed text
and contributing to successful
implementation of the Strategy in
practice.

The main focus of the Committee was on activities aimed at improving IT education. In partnership with the Ministry of Education, Science and Technological Development, the Committee organized a Roundtable that attracted representatives of both the private sector and academia. The Roundtable was an opportunity to hear **best practices** of successful cooperation between technical faculties from Belgrade, Novi Sad and Kragujevac and **AmCham member companies** (Cisco, Comtrade, Microsoft Development Center, NIS, Schneider Electric DMS. Trizma), as well as to reach an agreement on the next steps toward the establishment of a joint knowledge innovation platform.

LABOUR REGULATIONS COMMITTEE

The Labour Regulations Committee successfully advocated for amendments to the Labour Law with over 70% of suggestions adopted in the Law. Such success was possible only through constant discussion with all stakeholders and providing concrete suggestions in all phases of the law-drafting process. AmCham was also highly visible in the media on this topic. attracting significant criticism from labour unions, but still maintaining open and transparent exchange of opinions on concrete policy positions.

Upon adoption of the Law,
AmCham organized a Roundtable
on the implementation of the
changes to the Labour Law, with
representatives from the Ministry
of Labour and cleared up problems
related to compliance and transition
provisions.

The Labour Regulations Committee provided suggestions for improving the **Law on Employment of Foreigners** with partial success.

REAL ESTATE COMMITTEE

The main focus of the Committee was on adoption of the new Law on Planning and Construction to unlock the real estate industry. The Law on Planning and Construction was adopted in December 2014, featuring most of AmCham suggestions. Key improvements concern:

Construction permit procedure – this has been completely reformed with the aim of speeding up the process, mainly by providing a sort of one-stop-shop for investors.

Level of compensation for land development – this was retitled the contribution for land development, thus it was significantly reduced from up to 45 times higher to up to 6 times higher in the most expensive zone with respect to the least expensive.

Nonetheless, one of the major stumbling blocks – **conversion of the right to use land into ownership right still remains unsolved**. Thus it will be focus of Committee's advocacy efforts in 2015.

As for the other tasks from the Committee's 2014-2015 Agenda – adjustment of sectorial laws & speedy adoption of bylaws to the Law on Planning and Construction, the Committee joined in the work of the Economic Caucus of the National Assembly and working groups for drafting bylaws with the aim of contributing to speedy adoption of these changes.

INDEPENDENT PRACTITIONER'S REVIEW REPORT

TO THE TO THE MANAGEMENT OF THE AMERICAN CHAMBER OF COMMERCE IN SERBIA

We have reviewed the accompanying balance sheet of American Chamber of Commerce in Serbia (hereinafter referred to as "the Association") as of 31 December 2014 and the income statement and related Hotes for the year then ended (hereinafter the "financial statements").

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements in accordance with the accounting regulations prevailing in the Republic of Serbia, based on the Law on Accounting ("Official Gazette of the Republic of Serbia", no. 62/2013) and accounting policies described in Note 2 and 3, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error,

Practitioner's Responsibility
